THIRD SUNDAY OF EASTER

April 22, 2012

FROM THE DESK OF FR. MICHAEL TANG

The theme that occurs in all three readings this weekend is forgiveness. Forgiveness is available to all those who repent and believe in Jesus as their Savior. This has great relevance for all of us. A lot of ugly crimes are committed today, not all of which can be put down to ignorance. But if there is forgiveness for those who killed Jesus, then there is forgiveness for those who do these things. The task for those of us who live the Good News is to assure people that God's forgiveness is available to them, thus enabling them to make a fresh start.

In the First Reading Peter shows great courage when he confronts the people with their part in the death of Jesus. However, he goes on the excuse them on the grounds that they acted in ignorance. In this he might have been inspired by the dying prayer of Jesus: "Father, forgive them, they know not what they do." Peter urges them to repent, assuring them that if they do, their sins will be forgiven.

In the Gospel, Luke's primary interest is to show that the risen Jesus is the same person the apostles had known prior to the crucifixion. He emphasizes the reality of Jesus' bodily resurrection, but makes it clear that the resurrection is not a return to earthly life – Jesus has risen to a new life beyond death.

It was only by combining various passages from the prophets that the early Christians came to accept the idea that a suffering Messiah was part of God's plan of salvation. So Luke has the risen Lord showing the apostles how the Scriptures had foretold that the Christ would suffer and so enter into his glory. Jesus also gives them a mission – the proclamation of repentance and forgiveness of sins.

Finally, in the Second Reading John says authentic love is proved by obedience to the commandments. Anticipating that the Christian will sin, he reminds us that we have in Jesus an advocate who will plead our cause.

The next big event on our parish calendar is the annual Carnival. I encourage all those in our parish, (which includes our school) to make this church event a resounding success. Volunteers are needed to work the booths. We need all of you to spread the word by taking flyers and selling tickets. Finally, we need you to bring family and friends to the actual event which starts the Friday of Memorial Day Weekend. Carnival Workers Sign-ups will take place the weekend of May 5 and 6 so mark your calendars!
