From the Pastor's Desk

The feast of the Blessed Trinity, which we celebrate this weekend, brings us face to face with the mystery of God. We can know certain things about God by looking at creation, but it is Jesus who reveals to us the mystery of God.

In Biblical times it was common for wisdom to be personified. The reading from Proverbs looks to the role of Lady Wisdom in creation. This speculation about wisdom can be seen as a groping towards the revelation of the mystery of the Trinity. The Second Reading and the Gospel are chosen because they specifically mention the three Persons of the Holy Trinity, and the role of each Person in our salvation.

Paul stresses the role of Christ in our salvation. Through him hostility and alienation are overcome, and we are able to enter into relationship with the Father. Therefore, we can hope to share God's glory. This sure hope will enable us to persevere in spite of suffering. Through the Holy Spirit God's love is poured into our hearts.

The Gospel stresses the role of the Spirit – carrying on in the Church the work of Jesus after Jesus has departed to the Father. There will be no new revelation. There can't be, because Jesus is the revelation of the Father. The role of the Spirit will be to spell out to successive generations the contemporary significance of what Jesus said and did.

Pastor Scholarship Fund

Transfiguration School is accepting transfer students for the spring second semester in all grades, except Pre-K.
