Saints of the Week

July 6th – St. Maria Goretti, virgin and martyr, who died in 1902 at the age of eleven. She was stabbed to death preferring to die than to be raped. She knew her assailant, ca. 17 or 18, worked for the family. His conversion led to her canonization in 1950, the largest crowd ever assembled at that time in Rome. Her mother and her assailant were present at her canonization. She is patroness of teen-aged girls. [not observed this year as it occurs on a Sunday]

July 9th – St. Augustine Khao Rong, priest and companion martyrs, martyred between 1648 and 1930. 87 of these martyrs were born in China and were children, parents, catechists, or laborers, ranging from ages 9 to 72 years. This group included four Chinese priests; 33 foreign-born martyrs or women religious, especially from the Order of Preachers (O.P. – Dominicans) (including St. Francis Capillas, January 15th, 1648 R.I.P. proto-martyr of China). St. Augustine Khao Rong, a Chinese soldier who accompanied the prisoner, Bishop John Gabriel Taurin Dufresse, of the Paris Foreign Mission Society, to his martyrdom in Beijing. Moved by the Bishop's courage, Augustine sought baptism and not long after was ordained a diocesan priest; martyred in 1815; beatified in groups at various times, these 120 martyrs were canonized October 1st, 2000 by Pope John Paul, II.

July 11th – St. Benedict, Abbot, who wrote the famous "Benedictine Rule," and was noted for its wisdom and moderation, and need for obedience: "Let all follow the Rule as their guide in everything, and let no one rashly depart from it" (Rule, Chptr 3). He founded twelve monasteries including "Monte Cassino." Benedictines number ca. 7,600 religious; he is considered the "Patriarch of Western Monasticism," patron of Europe. He died in 547.

July 13th – St. Henry (II), together with his wife, St. Cunegunda, assisted the poor. As emperor, he respected the Church's freedom, fostering ecclesiastical and monastic reform; founded the See of Bamberg as a center for missions to the Slavs; patron of Benedictine oblates. [not observed this year as it occurs on a Sunday]

Safeguard the Children

No child should be LEFT ALONE without adult supervision on Sundays during or after Mass. Parents should be aware of where their children are at all times. ALL PARISH MINISTERS/ORGANIZATIONS should also know where their child members are at all times during their scheduled meetings. Ministry Leaders are responsible to stay with their child members until parents or guardians pick them up after the meeting is over.

DID YOU KNOW?

Help your children be aware of other children's or adults' unhealthy behavior...

Children do, in fact, offend against other children. This issue is not unique to a particular season. However, children may have more opportunities to be out of your immediate sight during the summer. For this reason, it's important to periodically remind your child that another child or adult -- even a child or adult they know and trust, may want to see or touch their private parts; try to touch their private parts; or want to show them their (the other person's) private parts. Tell your child that if one of these situations occurs, your child should say: "Stop it!" and should immediately tell you what happened.
